Job Purpose:

To responsibly lead the housing, supervision and welfare of our international students on the programme - planning and preparing for the smooth operation of the house, ensuring rules are followed and leading in resolving any house or welfare issues each day.

To manage a house register, ensuring all students are "checked-in" at the end of each day and that curfew and quiet time is observed. In doing so, the house parent will need to demonstrate diplomacy, respect and authority.

Excursion Days

You'll have the chance to join some excursions and assist ALs in managing the groups

Transfers

You might be asked to escort groups.



Activities

You'll join some Activities and help with groups



Arrivals

A key role for the house parent is the welcoming and settling in of groups when they arrive. As host of your house you will be responsible for:

- Welcoming groups to their "home"
- Giving an induction presentation
- Ensuring all signage is in place
- Managing the rooming process



House and welfare

The biggest part of a House Parent's job is overseeing the wellbeing, safety and consideration of others within the house you run. As host, you'll take the lead in making groups comfortable, settling them in them and dealing with their concerns and requests.

You'll be responsible for:

- Liaising with the School enterprise team on house rules
- Ensuring health and safety guidelines are followed
- Managing in-house facilities and operations
- Enforcing curfew and quiet times as per schedule
- Looking out for the wellbeing and happiness of all!
- Accommodation checks in line house policies

Centre Set-up & Maintenance



Setting up the centre and keeping it looking good needs a big effort from day 1. Your help will be key!

Academic support

Helping connect groups to their classes and working with the Teachers.

Meal Supervision

You'll eat with groups & colleagues whilst keeping an eye on canteen behaviour.

Accidents & sickness

Where necessary, supervising sick or injured children who can't take part.
